





























The 23rd Juried Art Exhibition

TIME is a construct created by humans to regulate life. We are the only animal that lives by the clock, and it creates a sense of linear movement stretching in two directions. We can only travel in one of those two directions. Time is endless, without shape, and certainly expands in every direction, but we have made time a sort of plank that we must walk; a balance beam that forces us in a single direction "forward". It does serve us, in the same way that many of our constructs serve us as social beings. In our construct of Time each act is irretrievable and indelible, and our understanding of self-worth is weighed accordingly. It is a tight rope from which there is no exit. We must walk it or fall, and some do fall - the homeless, the mentally ill... This balancing act requires discipline and fortitude, but most of all it requires community. It is community that supports the construct and helps keep us from losing our balance.






Curator's Note

Visitors' Reviews



The beauty of this exhibition lies in the diversity of pieces, both in the range of artists showcased and their media.

Some artists excelled while taking the theme into creative directions through their interpretations. The juxtaposition in Babette's "Time" is especially thought-provoking. There is power in the shift between calm tones and parallel lines against the explosion of brushstrokes. Others are more literal on the theme of balance, such as Becherucci's watercolor "Tenaciously Hanging."

This is where the exhibition shows its limitations. With so many submissions to choose from, the curators decided to choose works they considered "closest to the topic." In some cases, this means paintings that are a little on the nose, and it raises questions about the more abstract work that didn't make the cut. Even so, the pieces selected still give viewers a lot to consider and are worth checking out.

The Equilibrium Exhibition offers a captivating selection of works that delve into the delicate balance that brings peace to our lives. Viewing through the exhibition feels like an act of tightrope-walking itself, with each piece pushing and pulling at our emotions, teetering between life's extremes.

Aleksander Kusenko's oil painting, "The Wheat Fields," is my personal favorite, with its simple sense of tranquillity encapsulating the essence of true, positive equilibrium. Sofia Becherucci's watercolor, "Tenaciously Hanging," conveys both the exuberance of life and youth, as well as the fragility of life, with death lurking just beyond childlike joy.

Svetlana Stovba's "Just a Moment," an oil on canvas, beautifully captures the equilibrium of peace before the spark of chaos. The tranquility in the moment before balance is lost is poignantly depicted, reminding us of life's fleeting nature.

While many pieces resonated deeply, some fell short in both style and concept, feeling thematically removed from the subject. Despite this, the exhibition as a whole is a triumph, featuring an array of beautiful works by many skilled artists. The High-Wire Exhibition is a must-see for those seeking to explore the intricacies of equilibrium and the vital role it plays in our lives.
