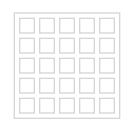
A new harbor, sometimes, is our own mind at peace with itself, the sweetest dream, our satisfied spirit at the end of the day or the moment just before waking up.

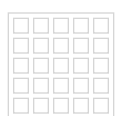

As one season passes, another takes its place. Though things may end looking rocky and bleak, there is peace throughout chaos as one knows a new beginning after the climax.

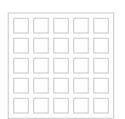


Curator's Note
