











As a curator, I focus on the theme of each show. When an artwork performance along the theme, I evaluate it by its standards. I notice some artists don't mention any description about the work. I understand some people don't want to say anything about the art on purpose, or just being shy to say in English because it's not her/his own language. In my themed show, it's precious for me to hear a voice of each artist at least even with only a couple of words. Sometimes, I hear deeper meanings implied into an artwork, which I believe talks to viewers, too.

It's always my pleasure to run a juried exhibition. I am humbly grateful for your interest and submission works. My next show is coming in Autumn. Let's impress and inspire viewers with your great artworks together! See you soon again.
