### **Exhibition Information**

"Who sees the human face correctly: the photographer, the mirror, or the painter?", Pablo Picasso

The human face is a mirror of a unique personality. Every anatomical detail such as eyes, nose, lips or the hair's texture tell a story of the person. Portraits and human expressions were represented in all types of art throughout history and showed how people looked like long before the art of photography was invented. These works serve as evidence of cultures, traditions, clothes designs or people. Portrait study was an important part of progression for many artists. It represented in different styles and genres. We can find portraits with a plain background and in home decor or landscape to emphasize belongings of a person to a certain class (the most popular portrait, "Mona Lisa" painted by Leonardo da Vinci, representative for the Italian Renaissance, reveal an enigmatic and mysterious expression, placed in a natural landscape with river and mountains.) Portraiture is the art of recreating a portrait and can capture a particular look or state of mind experienced by the model. This can be visually represented by many techniques, as pencils using tones of grey; colors, painting with strong or light brushes. History shows a lot of portrait examples, usually reflecting the purity, beauty, elegance in women and power, strategy, sharp characteristics in men. Today realism, hyperrealism or abstractionism in the art of representation a portrait is still very impressive and a way to communicate with people around the world.

I invite you all to be inspired by a face in your art representation. It can be a study of someone inspiring, a drawing, a painting or even a photography.








Her name is La Catrina and the essence of her story goes deep into Mexican traditions and roots but has been restyled only in the last century. It is believed that the Aztecs worshipped a goddess of death that they alleged protected their departed loved ones, helping them into the next stages.

The scratchboard technique is a two-dimensional subtractive process. It involves the use of abrasive tools to directly remove a surface layer of one value (typically dark) to expose a second layer (typically white). The values within the artwork are predominantly achieved by varying the amount of surface layer that has been scratched away or left. The texture and form of all key compositional elements within the artwork must be created by subtractive removal, not exclusively by the addition of paint or ink. Reapplying transparent mediums over the scratching is permissible, but the underlying scratches must remain visible. Works may be color or black and white.

Seers have also been shown to have visions on will, have prophecies, share visions with one another, and have an even stronger intuition. 





I delight in creating faces, and specifically the process of creating this painting was for me one of the challenges that I have enjoyed the most in recent months. Faces reflect, like no other part of the body, the infinite diversity of human nature. They are a reflection of the soul. That is why I have always felt captivated by face painting, showing that immense variety and infinite dissimilarity. Each of my faces is unique, exclusive. In this work I have been tempted by the challenge to capture two of the distinct facets of love. In my "Two of the Many Faces of Love" I was inspired by a dichotomous expression of this universal feeling. One of their faces, where less strident colors predominate, symbolizes the idyllic love between the couple, which has been idealized by visual artists, poets and musical composers of all time; that love where tenderness, generosity and the most complete sentimental dedication prevail. The other face, with stronger chromatic nuances, represents one of the other sides of love, that where sexual desire and the selfishness of one or both parties prevail, in the search, above all sentimental considerations, to satisfy the most primary desires of the flesh.








